The Granger Township Board of Trustees met for a properly advertised Public Hearing and Special Session on Thursday, November 12, 2020, 4:00 PM, at the Granger Township Administration Building, 3717 Ridge Rd., Medina. Present were Trustees: Richard L. Pace Chair, John H. Ginley, Jr. and Teri A. Berry and Fiscal Officer Donald L. Baker.

<u>PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE</u>: The meeting was opened at 4:00 PM with the Pledge of Allegiance by Trustee Richard Pace.

The purpose of the Special Meeting is to conduct a Public Hearing regarding Sign Regulations, review 2021 Appropriations, adopt 2021 Temporary Appropriations, consider CARES Act purchases, consider employment of CT Consultants for review of the Zoning Resolution, consider Purchase Orders and pay bills.

OPENING OF THE PUBLIC HEARING AND HEARING TOPIC: Mr. Pace opened the Public Hearing. The purpose of the hearing is to consider:

- 1. Proposed text amendments that regulate Article IV: Sign Regulations
- 2. Proposed text amendments that regulate Article X: Definitions

The Zoning Commission has made and unanimously passed a motion to recommend adoption of the proposed text amendments to Article IV: Sign Regulations and the proposed text amendments to Article X: Definitions.

ABSTENTIONS: Mr. Pacecalled for abstentions. There were none,

PUBLIC COMMENT: Mr. Pace asked if there were any public comments in favor of the proposed changes. There were no comments in favor of the proposed changes. He then asked if there were any public comments opposed to the proposed changes. There were no comments opposed to the proposed changes.

With no public comment, Mr. Pace closed the comment portion of the Public Hearing.

REVIEW OF PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO ARTICLE IV: SIGN REGULATIONS AND THE PROPOSED TEXT AMENDMENTS TO ARTICLE X: DEFINITIONS: The Board then reviewed the proposed changes to the Zoning Resolution. While expressions of appreciation were made for the work by the Zoning Commission, it was the consensus of the Board to make the following changes to the proposed amendments:

Article IV: Sign Regulations:

- 1. 401 D 3 The length of the building that faces the street or the length of the wall of the building that contains the main entrance to the uses therein shall be considered the building frontage as determined by the Zoning Inspector.
- 2. 402 A 2 b Freestanding signs shall be placed on private property no closer than thirty (30) feet from the edge of pavement of a subdivision street
- 3. 402 B 1 b Change Max Height in Table 402B.1 from 25 feet to 20 feet.
- 4. 402 B 2 (a) Additional Signs and Signs Area for Large Lots as defined below.
- 5. 403 B 3 EMC signs shall comply with
- 6. 405 B 2 Such Temporary signs may be erected.....
- 7. 405 C 2 Change eight (8) square feet to be twenty-five (25) square feet.
- 8. 405 G Should read: Temporary window sign(s) shall not exceed twenty percent (20%) of the window area, provided that the total area of both permanent window signs and temporary window signs shall not exceed the lesser of thirty-five percent (35%) or one-hundred (100) square feet.

OTHER PUBLIC COMMENT: Mr. Pace then asked if there was any other public comment. Jami Rak, 5026 State Road, Medina, OH, addressed the Board. She expressed concern about how addresses are not consistently viewable on SR 18. She is not sure if the sign discussion was where the safety concern should be raised or not but, she wished to bring it to the Trustees attention. It would be safer for drivers if addresses were clearer when they are looking for a specific location when traveling SR 18. Mr. Pace thanked Mrs. Rak and requested this issues be added to the proposed clean-up of the Zoning Resolution.

<u>CT CONSULTANTS:</u> Mr. Pace advised a quote of \$20,000.00 to help with the clean-up of the Zoning Resolution has been received from CT Consultants. It was decided that further discussion with CT Consultants was merited and this was tabled.

<u>COVID DISCUSSION:</u> Mr. Baker reminded the Board that it engaged Baker, Dublikar, Beck, Wiley & Mathews to assist us in determining if many of our proposed Cares Act purchases are consistent with the intent of the legislation establishing this funding. Attorney Greg Beck has reviewed may of our potential purchases and has issued an opinion advising they would be legitimate expenses. He has also provided Resolution No. 11-12-2020-2 which should be adopted at this meeting.

<u>RESOLUTION NO. 11-12-2020-2: APPROVING EXPENDITURES FROM CARES ACT</u> FUNDING:

Be It Resolved by the Township Trustees of Granger Township

WHEREAS, this date, November 12, 2020, Mr. Ginley moved the adoption of the following Resolution:

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, Ohio Governor Mike DeWine issued an Executive Order declaring a State of Emergency relating to the COVID-19 outbreak in the state of Ohio; and

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2020, the head of the World Health Organization declared COVID-19 a global pandemic; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the President of the United States, Donald Trump, declared a National Emergency concerning the COVID-19 outbreak, stemming from the SARS-CoV-2 virus; and

WHEREAS, on May 6, 2020, the Ohio State Senate Passed Am. S.B. No. 310 establishing a formula for the distribution of funds ("Funding") under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act ("CARES Act") enacted by the federal government; and

WHEREAS, Am. S.B. No. 310 was subsumed into the passage of Am. Sub. H.B. No. 481 by the Ohio General Assembly, effective June 19, 2020; and

WHEREAS, consistent with Section 27(D) of Am. Sub. H.B. No. 481, the Board passed a resolution supporting the receipt of the Township's share of Funding under the CARES Act, and the Township has since received such Funding and deposited same in the Township's Local Coronavirus Relief Fund pursuant to Section 27(E).

NOW THEREFORE, it is hereby RESOLVED by the Trustees that:

- 1. Pursuant to Section 27(D) of Am. Sub. H.B. 481, the Board may spend the Funding only to cover costs of the subdivision consistent with the requirements of section 5001 of the CARES Act as described in 42 U.S.C. 601(d) and subsequent regulations and treasury publications.
- 2. As assistance to local governmental agencies that have received distributions under Am. Sub. H.B. 481, the United States Treasury Department has published a pamphlet entitled Guidance State, Territorial, Local, and Tribal Governments as Amended, September 2, 2020 ("Guidance"), a copy of which is attached hereto. The Guidance publication provides succinct descriptions of permissible uses for the Funding. The Guidance has been adopted and accepted by the Ohio Office of Budget and Management ("OOBM") and the Ohio Auditor of State ("Auditor") as authoritative sources for Funding expenditures
- 3. In accordance with Section 27(D) of Am. Sub. H.B. 481, section 5001 of the CARES Act as described in 42 U.S.C. 601(d), federal regulations and the Guidance, the Board hereby approves the following expenditures from the Local Coronavirus Relief Fund:

The Board finds that the expenditures authorized by this Resolution were not previously budgeted by the Board in that these expenditures were redirected to allow fire department personnel to mitigate and respond to the COVID-19 pandemic; as a result, the Board finds the expenditures are directly related to COVID-19 conditions and response. Further, the Board finds that the expenditures authorized herein are for payments or reimbursements of an expense incurred between March 1, 2020 and December 30, 2020.

Mr. Pace the Motion, and thereupon, the votes in favor of this Resolution were recorded and reflected by the signatures hereto.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: that it is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Board of Township Trustees concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Board, and that all deliberations of this Board and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in a meeting open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Roll call resulted thusly: Mr. Pace, aye; Mrs. Berry, aye; and Mr. Ginley, aye.

<u>CARES ACT PURCHASES:</u> Mr. Baker requested approval of the following purchases using CARES ACT monies:

- 1. Accessary Fire Department (FD) Vehicle: This 2020 Chevrolet Tahoe will have a non-fabric interior to allow for better deep cleaning. Under current conditions, the Township has difficulty safely transporting personnel to/from calls and maintaining safe distances. The vehicle will be used for transport of personnel instead of using an EMS vehicle when it is necessary to bring individuals back to the Fire Station. YTD we have had 120 Fire and 202 EMS calls. Seventy-two of the EMS calls had COVID-like symptoms. Five cases were confirmed, but this number could be higher as we may not have received notification. EMS calls are increasing. A quote of \$38,942.00has been received from Ganley Chevrolet of Aurora.
- 2. 40 FD Pagers: Purchase of pagers will allow each Firefighter/ EMS to have an individual pager to prevent the need to share them. Each individual will be responsible for cleaning their assigned pager to limit the potential spread of the virus. A quote of \$25,460.00 has been received from Vasa Communications.
- 3. Medical Mannequin: This will be used by the EMS fully clothed in PPE to train how to work with patients (for example IV's and intubations). A quote of \$10,445.25 has been received from GT Simulators By Global Technologies, Davie, FL.
- 4. **FD Duty Uniforms:** This will allow the Fire/EMS personnel to have back-up uniforms available when multiple calls occur on a given day or when one uniform is being cleaned. A quote of not to exceed \$18,000.00 has been received from Shuttler's Uniforms.
- 5. <u>Pressure Washer:</u> This will be used to clean and decontaminate bays and vehicles. A quote of not to exceed \$3,681.00 has been received from 3R Sales and Service, Barberton, OH.
- 6. <u>2 Ozone Machines:</u> These will be used to decontaminate facilities and vehicles. A quote of \$1,260.00 has been received from Max Blaster LLC, Medina OH.
- 7. <u>18 Dell Computers:</u> Will be used for remote meetings. A quote of \$21,389.04 has been received from Dell Marketing LP, Pittsburgh, PA. It was suggested that this be approved at \$21,589.04 to cover potential shipping fees.
- 8. 10 FD SCBA Mask Communications Units: These units will improve both Fire and EMS communication during calls. Staff will be able to communicate more efficiently thereby limiting potential exposure to the virus by controlling the number of responders interacting with the public at calls. A quote of \$6,057.00 has been received from Warren Fire Equipment.
